MRC MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 20, 1999

- 1) A quorum was not present, so no official business could be transacted.
- 2) Correction to 1999 club calendar: The fest should be 8 AM to 5 PM, not 1 PM.
- 3) Technical: Northeast site is off line. UHF link signal is very weak.
- 4) Volunteers (organized by KB9PHA) are needed to hand out flyers at the Blue Star, State Fair Park, Computer Show: October 22,23,24. (This turned out to be impossible: Recent State Fair Park Regulations prohibit it. Also, N9NPB was escorted out of the show and his admission was refunded, for talking to vendors.)
- 5) Shall we increase our Computer Expo booth size if there are few booths?
- 6) N9NPB has contacted WTMJ-TV, Warner Cable, and some radio stations regarding advertising.
- 7) N9UUR and a Marquette student produced a 30 second video. It was shown three times for us. WOW, how professional. There was not enough time in 30 seconds to plug Ham Radio. W9ATK said we may need to include in the ad, who is the sponsor.
- 8) Per all the radio stations that we contacted, WLZR was mentioned as the best place for our advertising. (We are not so sure of that now, after the fest.)
- 9) N9NPB detailed some of the various prices for some advertising outlets at

various times of the day.

10) We will advertise on Warner Cable and WLZR, during the weekend and week before the fest. There was the question of how many dollars to spend. A suggestion was \$3000. KB9NYP asked what our total cash and bank account number was. The answer was over \$8000, so KB9NYP concluded it was OK to spend \$3000 on advertising. That seemed to generate a consensus.

11) Billboards are not practical.

12) In exchange for advertising, 8 passes are being given to WMSE, the radio station at the Milwaukee School of Engineering.

13) We are thinking of a raffle and are unsure of the legality. N9UUR will check. (The Class B raffle rules are easy for a 1 day event. We applied to the State of Wisconsin: Department of Administration: Division of Gaming, and did have a Class B License on November 6, 1999, fest day.)

14) There will be no Friday setup, because the hall is in use Friday evening.

15) Volunteers will be in two shifts: 5 AM to 11 AM, 11 AM to 5 PM.

16) N9WSZ talked about food. Breakfast = 3 pancakes, 3 link sausages, milk or orange juice or coffee = \$4 plus tax. 6:30 AM to 10 AM. Lunch = hamburgers, brats, beans, potato salad or chips, milk or orange juice or coffee or can soda. 11 AM to 2 PM. There will be a condiment table.

17) Cindy Borchardt will serve the vendors at their tables.

18) Volunteers will get a free lunch.

19) Kitchen volunteers shift: 6 AM to 3 PM.

WOW, What a ride!

First, THANKS to the members and my fellow Board members for making this a very enjoyable and memorable year!

This was the year of "The Great Upgrade", AND "The Great Experiment".

The Capitol Improvement Fund made it's initial goal of \$5000 in June. The upgrades were made and the new Henry Power Amp installed on Aug. 14th; we have not been back since for anything related to the upgrades, not a tweak! On Line 100% since day one. That's good planning--and buying quality parts and gear. Congrats to the technical folk! And thanks to all who believed in the vision and trusted the plans by contributing their dollars. We have "more ideas left"... So please consider adding a few dollars to your dues this month to keep the "Capitol Improvements" to our

machine alive and funded!

This was also the year of the "Great Swapfest Experiment". We split the fest in two: a Hamfest and a Computer Expo. It was a learning experience to say the least. And, the discussion of how to continue should be the first agenda point for the 2000 Board of Directors. For the first time, a Milwaukee Amateur Radio Club purchased Broadcast Air and Cable TV ad time to promote our fest. I am very proud of all of us for taking the "risk" and promoting Ham Radio to the general public. It was VERY costly: we spent over \$3000.00 on the ads alone. The downward trend in HAM attendance at swapfests continues and we were not immune. HOWEVER, after all the numbers were totaled up, and every expense paid, we made over \$1950.00 profit on this year's fest. Given that we expected an overall LOSS due to the first time ad budget, WE ALL DID VERY WELL! The Swapfest (in whatever form) is a great deal of work and I would encourage next year's Board to find further innovative ways to improve it and delegate the work and responsibilities. Perhaps a separate "Fest Committee" to take over the operation, to allow the Board to simply oversee and get on to other things. Volunteers Needed!!!

The Board has continued its work and developed a budget for 2000 based on a conservative, reality view of this year. I feel it is workable and within the Club's means. It will be presented at the Annual Meeting. The Audit Committee is starting work on the review of 1999, and our goal is to have a complete review and report done and ready for presentation at the Annual Meeting as well. In general, we made and spent more money in 1999 than any other year in the Club's history. It has been very interesting and time consuming to keep "all the numbers straight" and available to the Board and Membership as we have gone along--and I have enjoyed every minute!

So, Thanks again to all those who helped me this year and again to all those who stood by us with their dollars to the Capitol Improvement drive. There are so many who did so much, The Technical Committee, those "stealthy" Control Ops, my Financial Review Committee,

and the other members on this year's Board. I however do wish to single out one person, and recognize his long standing efforts. One of the founders of the "Capitol Improvement" concept 3 years ago, the designer of the "Great Upgrade" at Mainsite and the person who 9 times out of 10 is "using" the screw driver at the sites (not just holding it like I do), one of the people who master-minded the successful "Computer Expo" and then made it happen, and behind the scenes something you all didn't see, a good moderator of a "diversity of opinions and views" on the Board and committees this year. My thanks, and greatest respect to my friend Mike, N9NPB.
