A Note from the Secretary

As I write this, it is towards the end of the February 15th Fun Net on the Pros and Cons of the MRC. As I sat here and listened to my husband, Mark KB9VJQ, speak on his second go round; he brought up a subject, which interests me. He read The Five Principles of Amateur Service. These come from The Complete FCC U.S. Amateur Part 97 Rules and Regulations and they were so insightful that I thought they should be printed as a reminder of why we all became Amateur Radio Operators.

To quote Section 97.1 of the FCC Rules and Regulations, the FCC describes the basis and purpose of the amateur service as: "The rules and regulations in this part are designed to provide an amateur radio service having a fundamental purpose as expressed in the following principles:

(a) Recognition and enhancement of the value of the amateur service to the public as a voluntary noncommercial communication service, particularly with respect to providing emergency communications.

(b) Continuation and extension of the amateur's proven ability to contribute to the advancement of the radio art.

(c) Encouragement and improvement of the amateur service through rules which provide for advancing skills in both the communications and technical phases of the art.

(d) Expansion of the existing reservoir within the amateur radio service of trained operators, technicians and electronics experts.

(e) Continuation and extension of the amateur's unique ability to enhance international goodwill."

I thought this information might help us to consider why we became Amateur Radio Operators. It is available to all of us but sometimes we forget or we don't review the information in Part 97 of the Rules and Regulations.

We are the repeater club for the person who talks too much, too little and everyone in-between and when we hear that person we will make an effort to know that person, welcome them, include them, and assist them because we have our Principles of Amateur Radio.

MRC Meeting Minutes January 18, 2003

Wauwatosa Savings Bank in Oak Creek. Napoleon, NØXXL, club president, called the meeting to order at 6:42pm. All who were present made introductions.

New Members: A motion was made by KB9EWG and seconded by N9RXD to accept the following for membership to the MRC; Jason KC9WTH, Jim KB9UDL, Mike KB9KEJ, Dave W9FDA, Matt KC9COY, Allen N9WHO, Ted KB9PQZ, Dave K9DOE and Dave KC9CLM. Motion passed. Welcome to our new members.

Technical: Mike, N9NPB stated that the system is at 100%. The Northwest site is now working. Mike stated that it is time to start replacing the radios at all the sites when one must be repaired. The reason for the replacement instead of getting the radio repaired is that the radios are old and no longer being made. Also the cost to repair a radio is just slightly less then the cost of a new radio. It is recommended that we start replacing at least one radio a year as needed. Mike would also like to see the Technical Committee reestablished. N9KXA stated that the problem with the blown fuses at main site has been repaired. When the system was on battery backup, the battery lasted 16 hours with power to spare.

Club Minutes: Napoleon stated that we have no minutes for the October membership meeting due to a computer error. Tom, AB9EK was not present at this meeting to take the minutes. Napoleon asked someone else to take the minutes. Napoleon hopes to reconstruct the minutes.

Activities: Janet does not have a date for the March weather-training meeting. She is waiting to hear from Roger if we can use the room at his place of employment. Last year's meeting was held at The Fortis Company, 501 W. Michigan Street, Milwaukee. Hope to have the meeting at the same location.

Treasurers Report: Gary, N9UUR gave the highlights of the 2002 Financial

Review Report. As of 12\01 the club memberships stood at 258. At the end of 12\02 the membership was 249. The capitol improvement fund is up and the field day group has funds for this year. There were 404 plus the volunteers who had attended the swapfest. The fest made a profit of \$886.00. The club also made a profit for 2002 of \$1159.56. So far for 2003 there have been 128 members who have renewed their dues. As of Jan.14, 2003 the total of all accounts is \$13,893.26 and actual expendable funds are \$5,294.77.

Proposed Budget for 2003: Gary explained the budget that was put together for 2003. Income is expected to be \$9800.00 and expenses \$10,850. The income number is low because it is based on 210 members renewing their dues. Over the years there is an increase in membership that brings this total up. The Technical Committee budget is up due to the need to start replacing the old radios. A motion was made by KB7QDI and seconded by KC9AYN to accept the budget as proposed for 2003. Motion passed.

Swapfest: There was a discussion on whether the club should have a swapfest for 2003. Napoleon asked for volunteers to help chair the event. Those who said they would help are KC9COY, N9UX and KB9VJQ. A show of hands was asked for, for those who would help at the event. A motion was made by N9GNG and seconded by KC9COY to have a swapfest in 2003. Motion passed.

Financial Review Committee Report: Jack, W9ULA reported on the internal audit that was performed on January 10, 2003 by the Financial Review Committee. The committee certified that the club expenses and income balanced. The committee consisted of W9ULA, N9WBN, KB9RCB, AA9JW and W9WJV. It was suggested by the committee that the software "Quicken" be used as the official means of keeping the books. It was also suggested that the year-end report that was processed by Gary, N9UUR, be used a template for all future reports. A motion was made by Dean Pearson, KB9RCB, seconded by N9KXA that the MRC, as recommended by the Financial Review Committee, officially adopt "Quicken" software as the standard bookkeeping program to be utilized by it's treasurer in keeping the financial records of the club. Such software to be provided by and licensed to the club. Discussion occurred. N9UUR stated that the club owns the "Quicken" software. Motion passed. Motion by Dean Pearson, KB9RCB, seconded by KC9AYO that the MRC, 2002 Treasurer's Year-end Report be considered

the "form and template" for future Year-end Reports. Discussion occurred. Motion passed.

Other Business: Mike, N9NPB stated that at the Board meeting Tom, AB9EK look through the club records that he has in his possession to see when a Financial Review Committee was established. A motion was then made by N9NPB that the Financial Review Committee be a standing committee as part of the MRC and audits of the financial records be done every year. The motion was seconded by N9KXA. Discussion occurred. Motion passed.

Old Business: Napoleon stated that the club is still waiting for the vanity call that was applied for. The club call is KC9CNX.

New Business: The question was asked if the club would be interested in having a booth at the Midwest Energy Association Fair. This happens the weekend before field day at Stevens Point. More information to come. Napoleon stated that the club might have a booth at this year's State Fair to set up an amateur display. Also the Wisconsin Army National Guard has asked for our assistance for an exercise in August. N9MGJ will have more information at a later date. Deb, KB9ISE thanked those individuals who do the Public Service Announcements. Napoleon thanked those individuals who do the all the nets. He also thanked John, KC4AME and Mary, KC9AST for all they have done for the area and the club. N9RXD, Al asked for permission to use the MRC logo for the Diabetes Association. He will also need volunteers at a later date. A motion was made by N9UUR to allow the MRC logo to be used by Tour De Cure for 2003. KC9COY seconded. Motion passed. Warren, K9IZV stated he had nametags for everyone and a printed roster. Napoleon read a statement of what is expected of Board members.

Meeting recessed at 8:04pm for refreshments. The meeting resumed at 8:30pm with the elections.

Election results: President Napoleon NØXXL, Vice President Bob AB9FB, Secretary Maureen KB9VLJ, Treasurer Eileen KB9ZHV and Activities Manager Janet KB9ZAG.

Warren announced the names of those who had the most hits on his lists. They received a free dinner. A song was sung to all the names Warren announced.

Motion to adjourn was made by KB9PZQ and seconded by KC9COY. Meeting adjourned at 10:00pm.

Technical Committee: No major

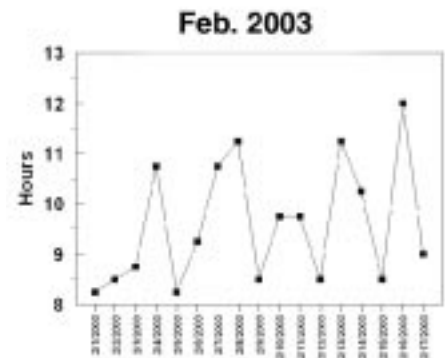
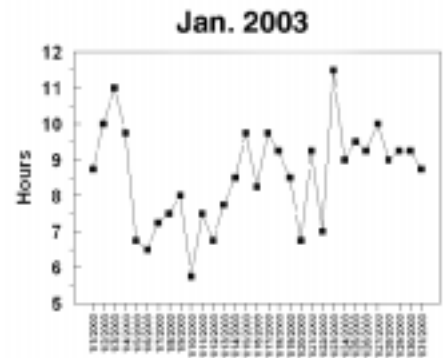
